White, black, natural wood...simple ? Let's not be fooled! The apartment in Warsaw's Żoliborz district is actually very sophisticated.

Designers Agata Melerska and Zofia Wyganowska undertook a complete renovation of a 55 meter apartment in the greenest part of Warsaw. A characteristic feature of the interior are repeated curves. You can see them on the closet in the bedroom, in the bottom row of cupboards in the kitchen or on the fireplace. The fireplace is the most intriguing element of the decor. Next to it, the owner placed a large stack of logs. This is where the lounge area connects with the dining room and the kitchen. Above the massive vintage table hangs a lamp designed by George Nelson. The kitchen is open, but almost all utensils and dishes are hidden in ingeniously arranged cabinets. The kitchen countertop is made of wood in natural color.

The living space is separated from the bedroom with a glass construction made of steel frames. It isolates, but does not constitute a barrier for daylight. Thanks to that, the apartment is bright and spacious. The bathroom is kept in black and white tones, on the floor there is terrazzo in deep bottle color.
