Konstancja and Jurij are interior designers and owners of an online shop with ready designs. They work mostly at home, surrounded by plants and amazing collection of movie posters. We are people of many passions and we wanted to make a mark on our space with it. You can definitely see us in our space. – says Konstancja.

Home is located in Kraków, Poland. In a district called „Wesoła”, which means „Happy”. Neighbourhood is quiet, full of old tenement houses, very close to Old Market Square. The apartment is 135 square meters and it has two levels - the ground floor and the mezzanine. It's a one big open space with a separated bedroom, but there are also sofas and beds on the mezzanine.

We actually fell in love in this place when we first saw the real estate agency advertisement. It had everything we dreamed of - big window, open space, height and a great location. Price was also very good, because the place was totally ruined but it didn't scared us - we were after one general renovation so we knew what to do. When we enter the ruin we looked at each other and we knew this is it. Our dream-come-true, our loft in the city center. - – says Konstancja.

The couple renovated it by themselves with a help of only one man and it took them 3 years. The place was in a disasterous condition but Jurij saw a huge potential in it. Designers don't like too consistent interiors but mixing styles. They always try to do some twists, and their apartment basically is a twist and mix. They love to travel, finding best inspiration in new places.

Bathroom is Spanish, but it's also Scandinavian, bedroom is Scandinavian, but it has big contrastic wardrobe to keep the balance. In the open space we have minimalistic full white kitchen, kind of eclectic and boho living room. And everything is connected by Spanish decorations and Polish design.– says Konstancja.

The apartment is also very „Polish” - designers wanted to show that on every step. There is a lot of things referring to Kraków and to Poland, like posters for example - on the mezzanine there is a small gallery of—a movie posters from famous Polish School of Poster.

The furniture are mostly from IKEA and some old stuff which Jurij and Konstancja found on flee market . Now their goal is to slowly change some of the furniture and add another style to the mix - retro. They love changes and like to put pieces and decorations which means something to them.
