I like colors and living in a simple, geometric space which does not have the structure of a conventional apartment," says Agata. As an architect arranging a new place for her family, she approached the design process very relaxed. An apartment of over 100 square meters in Milanówek, near Warsaw, turned out to meet all the needs of a family of four. It has a comfortable functional layout, high non-plastered ceiling, which the family dreamed of. The heart of the house is a large kitchen table, where children draw, read and neighbors chat. In the kitchen, Agata designed a plywood cabinet that matches the terazzo countertop. The floor is made of concrete, which is no longer perceived as cool when the colors around it are intensified. The strong green of the sofa corresponds with the contemporary paintings and the yellow bookcase of the Polish brand Tylko. It holds the record collections of the head of the family. The bedroom is a place for relaxation and reading, as the family likes to surround itself with good literature.
