Magda, the owner of this house, is an interior designer who loves eclecticism, English classics, a subdued color palette and nonchalance in selected accessories. Thanks to this combination, her house is a dream place to live. The house is located in the buffer zone of the Kashubian forests, right by the lake, surrounded by a beautiful garden and a home vegetable patch. Magda lives there with her husband and 3 children. The interior is built on a classic layout where on the ground floor is a kitchen with a dining room and a living room as an open living space, while on the first floor we have a bedroom, study and children's rooms. In the durable elements of the interior, Magda used simple, classic solutions thanks to which the house is timeless and ages well. Such a conscious choice allows her to often change the arrangement of the interior with accessories or seasonal flowers and plants directly from the surroundings of the house. In addition, Magda cleverly combined furniture and vintage lamps, art and design in the decorative elements of the interior. All these elements intertwine to form a coherent picture, and none of these parts is dominant. Magda's favorite combination in the spring and summer period is the introduction of lush greenery to the interior. This color makes her home very lively and blends naturally with the surroundings. Most days the family lives with the windows open to the garden, which additionally increases the living space by the area of the associated terrace. This part becomes their living room in the summer, this is where they spend most of the day reading books, eating meals, meeting friends. On the private level of the bedroom, the rooms have a natural layout with a sloping roof, which has significantly reduced the area of the rooms. Thanks to the bright colors used by Magda and a lot of natural light, despite the roof arrangement, the interiors of this level are still spacious. The greenery of the garden flows through the roof windows and in the evenings you can also admire the stars in the sky through them from the bed or bathtub. As an interior designer, Magda pays great attention to interesting solutions and details. That is why the interior features interesting fabrics, a lamp made of mother-of-pearl or handmade paper, paintings by artists interspersed with children's drawings. All this together creates a place conducive to rest and tranquility.
